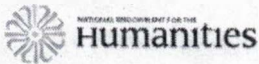

27 Citizens of Corbin

Indicted In Race Riot

Corbin, Ky.—Twenty-seven per-
sons, many prominent citizens, have
been indicted as members of the
mob which ran all negroes from the
city October 30, following a race riot
after holdup of a white man at a
carnival.

None of the 300 negroes driven
from Corbin have returned, although
some are property owners.

Only one negro, an aged servant
of a prominent family, remains.
